What is Rotary?

Rotary was born in Chicago, IL on February 23, 1906. Throughout its history Rotary's main objective has been service - in the community, in the workplace, and throughout the world. Rotary International (RI) has developed a broad range of programs designed to help clubs carry out this vital mission. Some of these programs have been underway for many years, while others have been developed more recently to meet emerging needs. Rotary's community development programs address many of today's most critical issues: hunger, the environment, literacy, to name a few. Soccer Classic

Our most successful fundraising project conducted in 2018-2019 is our Rotary Soccer Classic. We invite boys' and girls' soccer teams from the local area to play and compete in a soccer tournament. The proceeds fund the charities which our Charities Committee selects for the year. We also sell ads for the program and charge admission.





Happy Feet

This is a project to give underprivileged school children shoes and socks. We hold the event in October at Target, giving shoes to approximately 250 - 300 children. About one-half of our club members attend, along with a few members from the East Cooper Breakfast Rotary Club, the Interact Club, and the Rotaract Club.

Once a month, during the school year, we pack 612 weekend meals for 145 elementary school children in the East Cooper area. We work with the Lowcountry Food Bank, 2864 Azalea Dr., Charleston, placing the packaged food in bags ready for delivery when needed.
