Anna Huckabee Smith is a Certified Wildlife Biologist® with the South Carolina Department of Natural Resources (SCDNR). She is the Director of Conservation Grants and Strategic Outreach, overseeing the State Wildlife Action Plan (SWAP) and the associated State Wildlife Grants Program. She also is the Coordinator for the Forest Legacy

Program. Anna writes the land acquisition grants for SCDNR and during her tenure for the agency has procured over \$85M dollars in awards and the conservation of over 71,000 new acres (112 square miles) for the State of South Carolina.

Before her current job with SCDNR, Anna was an Urban Wildlife Biologist with the North Carolina Wildlife Resources Commission where she helped create the program in place today. Before that, she was the SCDNR Forest Stewardship Coordinator and authored over 135 management plans for private and corporate landowners. Anna is the immediate past President of the SC Chapter of The Wildlife Society and is a past Chair of the SEAFWA Wildlife Diversity Committee. She received a BS in Biological Sciences with a Minor in Anthropology from Clemson University and her MS in Zoology, also from Clemson, with an emphasis in ornithology. Anna has published over 36 articles on various wildlife topics as a free-lance writer and currently serves on several steering committees and working groups covering a variety of natural resource topics.

Member Spotlight!



Jerry George is a retired veterinarian and has been a member of our Rotary Club since 2,000.

He was raised on a farm in Michigan and earned a degree from Michigan State

University Veterinary College. Subsequently, he was enlisted in the Army Veterinary Corps. His service took him to Atlanta, Georgia, and Vietnam, where he inspected food products and establishments catering to Army personnel. Additionally, he operated an animal clinic to provide care for the pets of soldiers and managed a drug depot for the 80 other veterinarians stationed in Vietnam, ensuring they had the necessary supplies to care for Sentry, Scout, and Tracker dogs.

After serving in the Army, he established a mixed small and large animal veterinary practice in Marshall, Michigan. After a few years, he decided to sell the practice and start a small animal clinic in Mt. Pleasant caring for pets for the next 34 years until retirement.

He has been active in veterinary organizations at the local, state, and national levels, and involved in the Mt. Pleasant Presbyterian Church. He has been a board member and past president of our club.
